

TECHNICAL SERVICE BULLETIN 1336

TO: ALL GRAVELY OUTLETS

DATE: FEBRUARY 16, 1970

SUBJECT: BATTERY WARRANTY, GRAVELY-DOUGLAS BATTERIES

The Gravelly-Douglas Battery has a warranty of 90 days from date of sale or 12 months from shipping code date, whichever occurs first. The shipping code date is indicated by a letter in a triangle. Example  indicates the month of March, 1970.

Submit the claim for a defective battery to Gravelly on the standard Gravelly Warranty claim. Hold the Battery until the approved claim has been returned. If the Battery is to be inspected, the returned claim will advise you of what procedures to follow.

IMPORTANT: When filing a warranty claim for one of these batteries, the section of the claim used to describe the work performed must show the code date and the specific gravity reading of each cell starting with the cell nearest the positive terminal. **NO BATTERIES WILL BE APPROVED FOR WARRANTY WITHOUT THIS INFORMATION.**

The credit on the warranty claim will be issued at dealer factory net price less a scrap allowance on all Batteries that are not required for inspection. These Batteries may be disposed of at the dealer level upon receiving the approved warranty claim.
